Philippians 1:1-2

- Paul and Timothy, bond-servants of Christ Jesus, To all the saints in Christ Jesus who are in Philippi, including the overseers and deacons:
- ² Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.



Philippians 1:3-5

- ³ I thank my God in all my remembrance of you,
- ⁴ always offering prayer with joy in my every prayer for you all,
- ⁵ in view of your <u>participation</u> in the gospel from the first day until now.



Philippians 1:6

⁶ For I am confident of this very thing, that He who began a good work in you will perfect it until the day of Christ Jesus.

Philippians 1:7-8

⁷ For it is only right for me to feel this way about you all, because I have you in my heart, since both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel, you all are partakers of grace with me.

⁸ For God is my witness, how I long for you all with the affection of Christ Jesus.



Philippians 1:9-11

- ⁹ And this I pray, that your love may abound still more and more in real knowledge and all discernment,
- so that you may approve the things that are excellent, in order to be sincere and blameless until the day of Christ;
- ¹¹ having been filled with the fruit of righteousness which comes through Jesus Christ, to the glory and praise of God.

Let's Return to 1:6



Philippians 1:6

⁶ For I am confident of this very thing, that He who began a good work in you will perfect it until the day of Christ Jesus.

Philippians 2:12-13

¹² So then, my beloved, just as you have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, work out your salvation with fear and trembling;

¹³ for it is God who is at work in you, both to will and to work for His good pleasure.

2 Peter 3:10



But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, in which the heavens will pass away with a roar and the elements will be destroyed with intense heat, and the earth and its works will be burned up.



Colossians 2:6-7



- ⁶ Therefore as you have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him,
- ⁷ having been firmly rooted and now being built up in Him and established in your faith, just as you were instructed, and overflowing with gratitude.



1 Thessalonians 5:23-24



- Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you entirely; and may your spirit and soul and body be preserved complete, without blame at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- ²⁴ Faithful is He who calls you, and He also will bring it to pass.



1 Peter 5:10



¹⁰ After you have suffered for a little while, the God of all grace, who called you to His eternal glory in Christ, will Himself perfect, confirm, strengthen and establish you.



Hebrews 13:20-21



- Now the God of peace, who brought up from the dead the great Shepherd of the sheep through the blood of the eternal covenant, even Jesus our Lord,
- equip you in every good thing to do His will, working in us that which is pleasing in His sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom be the glory forever and ever. Amen.



God's Resurrection Power is at work!

- God is at work in us.
 - He gives us the will to do the work.
 - He gives us the ability/energy to do the work.
- We walk in Christ, having been rooted and built up, overflowing with gratitude.
- God sanctifies us. He is faithful and will bring it to pass.
- God perfects, confirms, strengthens, establishes us.
- The same power that raised Jesus from the dead is at work in us!



Resurrection Power

- Is at work in you.
- Is available TO you through Christ.



Joy through Prayer

- "Thanksgiving and the sound of a melody" (Isaiah 51:3)
 - In Phil 1:3, Paul immediately mentions thanksgiving
 - Paul instructs Timothy...

1 Tim 2:1-2



- ¹ First of all, then, I urge that entreaties and prayers, petitions and thanksgivings, be made on behalf of all men,
- ² for kings and all who are in authority, so that we may lead a tranquil and quiet life in all godliness and dignity.


Ezekiel 22:30

²² Cast your burden upon the LORD and He will sustain you; He will never allow the righteous to be shaken.




1 Peter 5:6-7
